1st I will that my body be decently buried by the side of my husband and our graves piled in.

2^d I give and bequeath to Nicy Hamilton one dollar and to Rhoda a sister of Nicy name not known one dollar

3^d I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Maness and her bodily heirs one hundred and seven and 1/2 acres of land lying in Union County adjoining the lands of Thos Maness and others as fully described in a deed I hold, by lines meets and bounds.

4 I do hereby appoint Thomas Maness and wife Elizabeth Maness as my Executors and to take care of me as long as I live and when I am dead to pay all debts which may be made for me.

thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said Will as an attesting
witness thereto and at the request and in the presence of the said testator,
that at the time the said testator subscribed her name to the said Last
Will as aforesaid, and at the time he subscribed his name as a witness
thereto, the said Nancy Medley was of sound mind and memory, of full
age to execute a Will, and was not under any restraint to the knowledge,
information or belief of the deponent. It is therefore adjudged that the said
paper-writing and every part and clause thereof is the Last Will and
Testament of Nancy Medley, deceased, and ordered that the same be
recorded and that Letters Testamentary be issued to Thomas Maness
and Elizabeth Maness the executors therein named.
