

Noah Chaney last will & testament

State of North Carolina Union County Feb 27th 1863

In the name of God, Amen

The last will and testament of Noah Chaney made the day and date above written as follows

I the said Noah Chaney being in my right mind and without being biased or persuaded doth proceed to make the following division and distribution of the property owned and possessed by me in the County of Union North Carolina as follows viz

1st It is my will and desire that one tract of land containing one hundred and eleven acres more or less lying on Chinguepin in Union County N.C. adjoining the lands of J Helms and A Tomberlin & others be sold and a set of Blacksmith and out of the proceeds of the sale of said land and tools my debts are to be satisfied Fifty Dollars donated to my father Jackson Chaney and the remainder to my wife Beeda M Chaney during her widowhood

The remainder of my property to be kept and retained by my wife Beeda M Chaney during her widowhood and in case the said Beeda M Chaney marries it is my will and desire that all the property be sold except one bed andstead and clothing for the same which I bequeath to my wife Beedy M Chaney. The effects of said sale to be divided as follows

will and testament in witness whereof I have here unto
set my hand and affixed my seal
