Item second I give and devise to my beloved wife

Twenty acres of land more or less adjoining the place

lands of J. W. Lewis the Phifer gold mine & others
also all of my stock consisting of Cattle hogs corn
 fodder wheat flour bacon &c also all my farming
tools blacksmith tools and mining tools also all of
my household and kitchen furniture also all my
money on hand and all my notes and accounts
in fact all of my estate to have and to hold to her
the said Harriet Harris in fee simple forever
I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friends
J. M. Price my lawful executors to all intents and
purposes to execute this my last will and testament
according to the true intent and meaning of the same
and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking
and declaring utterly void all other wills and
testaments by me heretofore made In witness whereof
I the said Salathiel Harris do hereunto set my
hand and seal this 25th day of October A.D. 1877
