Simpson Davis' Last Will and Testament

In the name of God Amen.

I Simpson Davis of the State of North Carolina
and County of Lenoir being of sound mind
and memory but in feeble and declining health
and calling to mind the uncertainty of my Earthly Existence and that is appointed for all men
once to die do make and declare this my last will
and testament in manner following

that is to say principally and first of all I recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God who
gives it. and body to be buried in a decent Christian
like manner suitable to the wishes of my Relations
and friends and as touching my Earthly Estate
that it has pleased God to bless me with my will and
desire is that it be disposed of as follows

Item the 1st I give and bequeath to my wife Rebeccaie Davis
One hundred and fifty acres of land including the house and
improvement off of the East end of the land on which I
now live

Item the 2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife all my per-
ishable property of every description for and during her
widowhood to enable her to Raise and Educate my children
and for her own support

Item the 3rd my will and desire is that at the death of my
wife or her marriage that all the property above bequeathed
be sold to the highest bidder Except the land and equally
divided amongst all my children by her

Item the 4th I give my wife full privilege on all the land
that I own or may own at the time of my deceas during
the minority of ^{my} children and ^{when} all my children come of
full age then the land not bequeathed to her shall be
given over to them to devide or sell as they chuse

Item the 5th my will is that the land first bequeathed to my
wife after her death be divided between all my children by her
as their is not enough to make them Equal with the
advancements that I have already given to my other first
children

Item the 6th my will is that my Executors here in after ex- .

Item the 6th my will is that my Executors here in after named shall out of the money first coming into their hands pay all my just debts together with my funeral expenses and then give them full power and authority to sell such things as they may deem proper to enable them to carry out this my last will to its full intent and meaning I her by appoint my wife and my son H.
