

Hannah Williams Will & Testament.

I Samuel Green of the County of Union and State of North Carolina Planter do make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made -

And first I direct that my Body be interred in a decent and Christian like manner, And as to my worldly Estate I dispose of the same as follows -

First I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my Executors from the sale of my personal Estate.

Secondly I will that all my personal Estate (Except such as is hereafter disposed off) Consisting of houses, hogs, cattle, household and kitchen furniture be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising from said sale of said property after paying the aforesaid debts & expenses to be equally divided between all of my children to wit: William, Robert, Margaret, Samuel, John, James, George & and Allen Heath and share alike so that the children of any of the deceased children above named may take the same share that their parent would take provided the same were alive -

Thirdly I do will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy Green one black filly aged between two & three years also one Gant Calf

Thirdly I do will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy
Givens one black filly aged between two & three years also one Cow & Calf,
one bed and bed furniture, one pair of Cotton Cards, one Spinning Wheel
& one loom for and during her natural life or widowhood, also one pine
Chest and at the demise or marriage of my widow the said Lucy
Givens, all of the said property except the said Pine Chest to be sold
and equally divided between my surviving heirs so that the children
of any of the within named Legatees may take the share that the Parent
would be entitled to provided he or she were alive.

Fourthly I do will and dispose of my Lands containing Seven
hundred & seven acres, comprehending the following tracts, viz; the
Sixty six Acre, the Weaver tract, the home tract and two tracts granted
to me by the State of North Carolina.

Fifth will unto my beloved wife Lucy Givens in the following
manner (viz) the dwelling house, the pasture field as is called the
Mabon field, the meadow branch field & the field including ^{the} ^{the} ^{giant} house and
old orchard together with the privilege of cutting timber on any
part of my whole plantation for the purpose of keeping in repair
the said premises to her allotted to have and to hold under her own
use and benefit during her natural life or widowhood and at the
death or marriage of her the said Lucy Givens, then the said
land to return into the common stock. I do further will

that my children William Givens, Robert Givens, Margaret Pardue, & the surviving children of my son Samuel Givens, and Jane the widow of my son John Givens & her children James Givens, George A Givens and Tabby Givens the widow of my son Allen Givens and her children shall settle on and abide in any part of my lands that is unoccupied so as not to interfere with the premises of those now residing on said land, and any of my above named children who will not settle on my lands, aforesaid or those now settled & will not remain on the said land but will move off and leave the same then the premises shall revert back, and be for the use & benefit of those who may still live and remain on the said premises & in no case shall any of the aforesaid children or their lawful representatives have the right to sell alien or transfer any of my aforesaid lands for if any of my heirs will not live and abide on the said lands, it shall then remain and be for the sole benefit of those of my heirs who may and will abide remain on and cultivate the same.

And I do hereby make and ordain my trusty friends Samuel M. Herring, & my son George A. Givens & William Brown executors of this my last Will and Testament.
