

Last Will & Testament of Sam'l P. Walker dated

I Samuel P. Walker of Union County State of North Carolina do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, And first I direct that my body be decently interred and my funeral expenses paid, And as to such worldly estate as it may please God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows.

I direct that Daniel Mc Walker my youngest son shall have my land that I now live on Boundary given Start at Flat Rock corner near School House and run to Little Sheep Hill near the River meadow, and then run so as to take in the new ground known as Council Patch, also of the spring branch ditch and if said ditch to spring or near by to ask lower than my old line to take it. If no water found there then run across east to my last line, the balance of my property both real and personal shall be sold except the Silver Horse and my silver watch and one bed and clothing that belong to bed which I give to my son Daniel Mc Walker. I also give to my daughter Nancy Mc Culin fifty dollars for attendance on

I give to my son Daniel Mc Walker. I also give to my
daughter Nancy Mc Dule fifty dollars for attendance on
me in my old age and she shall share equally equally
with the balance of my children, As heretofore stated
all of my property both real and personal shall be sold
except what I gave to Daniel Mc Walker and the pro-
ceeds equally divided, among my children except
Daniel, as I have give of his part while alive.

And do make and ordain my Son James G. Walker
Executor of this my last will and testament
In witness whereof, I Sam'l P. Walker the testator
have to this my will written on one of paper set my
hand and seal, this the tenth day of April one thousand
