

Last Will & Testament of Saml. P. Walkup decd

I Samuel P. Walkup of Union County, State of North Carolina do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. And first I direct that my body be decently interred and my funeral expenses paid, And as to such worldly ~~estate~~ as it hath pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows.

I direct that Daniel M. Walkup my youngest son shall have my land that I now live on Boundary given Start at Flat Rock Corner near School House and run to little sleep mill near the Bower meadow, and then run so as to take in the new ground known as Daniels Patch, across to Spring Branch ditch and up said ditch to Spring or near by to Ash Corner then my old line to where J. H. Robinsons Garden was, then run across east to my last line, the balance of my property both real and personal shall be sold except the Hairy Horse and my silver watch and one bed and clothing that belong to bed which I give to my son Daniel M. Walkup. I also give to my daughter Nancy M. Dulin fifty dollars for attendance on

daughter Nancy M. Walker fifty dollars for attendance on
me in my old age and she shall share equally equally
with the balance of my children, as heretofore stated
all of my property both real and personal shall be sold
except what I gave to Daniel M. Walker and the pro-
ceeds equally divided, among my children except
Daniel, as I have give of his part while alive.

And, I do make and ordain my son James C. Walker
Executor of this my last will and Testament
In witness whereof I Samuel P. Walker the Testator
have to this my will written on one of paper set my
hand and seal, this the tenth day of April one thousand
eight hundred and eighty five Samuel P. Walker
