Know all Men by these presents that I Thomas Ferrell Sen<sup>r</sup> of the County of Wake in the province of North Carolina for and in Consideration of the Sum of Seventy pounds Proclamation Money to me in hand paid by William Ferrell of the County and Province aforesaid the receipt whereof I do ~~xxxx~~ hereby Acknowledge and myself fully Satisfied and paid and by these Presents have Bargained Sold and Delivered unto the said William Ferrell all my Stock viz Horses, Cattle Hoggs and Sheep marked with a Crop in the Ear and under keel in left three feather Beds and furniture there belonging and all my Household Goods Potts, pans, Pewter, working Tools and Utentials, there belonging TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Bargained Premises Unto the said William Ferrell his Heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever and the said Thomas Ferrell Sen<sup>r</sup> do for myself my Heirs Ex<sup>ors</sup> Administrators and Assigns forever Warrant and Defend the Above mentioned premisses unto the sd William Ferrell and his Heirs forever and by these Presents do forever
