THE PETITION of Charles Bass Humbly Sheweth that your Petitioner is Now A Prisoner, and hath been Confined in Close Goal for the Space of thirty two days Charged in Execution at the Suit of Robert Reid & C^o for the Sum of Nine pounds & One penny half Penny Debt and Interest 10/6 and three pounds ten Shillings and Eleven pence Cost of said Suit; And whereas Your Petitioner is Willing to Make Oath that he hath not the worth of forty Shillings Sterling Money in any Worldly Substance either in Debts owing to him or otherwise howsoever Over and above his wearing Apparell, Working Tools, and Arms for Muster, And that he hath not at any time since his imprisonment or before Directly or Indirectly, Sold, Assigned, or otherwise Disposed of or made Over in Trust for himself or otherwise any part of his real or Personal Estate, whereby to have or Expect any Benefitt or Profit to himself or to Defraude any of his Creditors to whom He is Indebted, Your Petitioner therefore Humbly prayeth that he may be Admitted to the Benefitt of an Act of Assembly Intituled an Act for the Releaf of Insolvant Debtors with respect to the Imprisonment of their Persons, And Your Petitioner shall ever pray. - -
