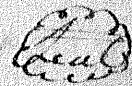

In the Name of God Amen I David Horton of the County
of Wake and State of North Carolina being Weak in Body
yet of a Sound and Perfect Memory and understanding
do make Ordain, constitute and Appoint this my Last will &
Testament in manner and form as followeth Inprimis I
give to my Son Samuel Horton Twenty Shillings, Item I give
to my Daughter Grace Barendsen Pounds, I give to my Son
David Horton his Hairs and Assign forever my Right to two
Hundred Acres of Land lying in the said County & Joining
Archibald Cannons line also One Feather Bed, I give to my
Daughter Sally Horton One Feather Bed, I give to my Son
Nathan Horton Five Pounds, I give to my Son Moses Horton
One Young Bay Horse called Park, I give to my Son William
Horton One Bay Horse called Bolton, I give to my Daughter

19 Melia Horton One Feather Bed, I give my Son Mathethias
