Last Will and Testament of David Wiggins dec<sup>d</sup>

In the Name of GOD Amen June 28th day 1779 I David Wiggins of Wake County and Province of North Carolina being Sick and Weak in Body but of a perfect Senses, Mind and Memory thank be unto God & therefore Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it tis appinted for all Men once to Die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament which is to say I principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the Hands of allmighty God that gave it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be burried in a Decent & Christian burial att the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named and as touching such Wourldly Estate as it hath Pleased God to Bless me with in this life I give Demisse and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form. I lend to my well bloved Wife Elizabeth Wiggins Six head of Cattle marked with a Cross and a Slit in the Right Ear. I lend likewise wone White Horse, To Beds and furniture two hides in tan wone Chist two brode hoes, three Chiseles two Argurs han saw & a gouge wone Ax wone hatchet wone fluke hoe two Pots three Dishes wone Bason and four puter plates four Pathen plates & Buttes Pot, Cream pot, Punch Bool, three knives & two forks two pare of Pothooks to piggins two Bedsteads to wone Spinning Wheel two pare of Cards to wone Saddle and Breadtree & two Cheares three Gugs wone Meal Sifter and Sarch & Skillet & wone pare of Stel-eards wone Drawing knife wone bridle, wone gimblet, To Bed cords to wone Basket, during ~~her~~ of her Natral life, & after hur Decesse to be Equally Divided between my four Children Named

follows Hannah Cullam, Mary Green, Gimmima Hix Elizabeth Bruer, last of all I do hereby Revoke Disanul and make Void <sup>all</sup> other legaces bequests made by me heretofore Ratifying and Confirming this alone to be my last Will and Testament unto which I appint my Wife Elizabeth Wiggins and Moses Hix my Executors In Witness whereof I have hearunto set my hand & affixt my Seal the day & date above Written.--

In the Name of God Amen I Elizabeth Monk Widow of Wake County and State of North Carolina being of Sound and perfect Mind and Memory blessed be God doe this twenty eighth day of February in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and eighty make and Publish this my last Will and Testament in manner folowing that is to say first I give and bequeath my Land whereen I now live to my two Youngest Sons Willis Monk and Silas Monk untill the are Twenty One Years of Age if the will live on it, but in Case the Cannot agree so to doe then for the land to be Sold by my Executors and for the Money to be divided Equally between them my two Sons Willis & Silas Monks and for my Executors to make a lawfull Deed of Conveance for the said Land to the Purchaser. Item I give and bequeath all my Pewter and my Pot, Skillet and frying pan Equally Divided
