Last Will and Testament of Christopher Woodward decd.

Christopher Woodward of Wake County and State of
North Carolina being well in Health and Perfect Memory
do make, Constitute and Ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following
(to wit) I give unto my Son Jordan Woodward all
my Land that lieth on the East side of Camp branch and
from the Mouth of said branch a direct course to the giving
line also three Cows and Calves, to him and his heirs forever
I give unto my Son Corbell Woodward all my
Land that lieth between Camp and Ready branch
and from the Mouth of the said Ready down the
course of Middle Creek to the first Drain
