In the Name of GOD Amen this Second day of July in the Year of Mans Redemption One thousand Seven hundred Seventy and three I William Speight of Wake County in the Province of North Carolina planter, being Sick, and weak, in Body but of perfect mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following manner and form -

Imprimis, I lend unto Abigail my Well beloved Wife the use and profit of the Plantation whereon I Live with the Land in that Tract thereunto Adjoining being by Estemation two hundred and forty Acres and two Negroe Men both Named Dick and One Negroe Woman Named Sarah, and two feather Beds and furnitures thereto belonging and Six Cows and their Calves two Steers and three Yearlings and three Mares One Rhoan One Bay & One Black in Coular and One black Horse or Gelding and all my Hogs raised at the said Plantation One Iron pot and One third part of my Pewter and One Side Saddle, and my Plantation Tools, & Casks and Six Chairs and One Disk and One Small walnut Table and One pine D^o and One linin Wheel and One Woollen D^o and One washing Tubb and One water pail and One pigginn, which use or lent 1771 the above said things to my abovesaid Wife
