THIS INDENTURE made the Ninth day of December
in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and
Seventy four; between James Martin Esquire presiding Jus-
tice of the Inferior Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions,
held in and for the County of Wake in behalf of himself
and his Successors in Office of the One part and John
Dempster of the County of Wake of the Other part -
Witnesseth that the said James Martin and the rest of the
Justices of the said Inferior Court according to the form,
of the Act of Assembly of the said province made in the
third Year of his present Majestys Reign entitled an Act
for the better Care of Orphans and Security and Manage-
ment of their Estates, have put out and Bound James Tate
Orphan of James Tate Deceased, and a poor Child of Wake
County aforesaid, Apprentice to the said John Dempster
untill the said James Tate shall Come to the Age of twen-
ty One Years (being or about the Ninth Day of December
last past the Age of Seventeen Years) during which time
the said Apprentice his said Master, well and faithfully
shall Serve, his Secrets keep, his lawfull Commands every
where gladly do, hurt to his said Master he shall not do,
nor willingly Suffer to be done by others but the same to
his power shall let or forthwith give Notice thereof to
his said Master. The Goods of his said Master he shall
not embezzle or waste nor lend them without his Consent
to any, from the Service of his said Master he shall not
at any time depart or absent himself without his said Mas-
ters leave; but in all things, as a Good and faithfull
Apprentice shall and will demean and behave himself
towards his said Master;

And all Lawfull Orders Obey during the said Term. And the said John Dempster his said Apprentice the said Trade Science or Occupation of a Planter, which he now uses with all things thereunto belonging together with reading and writing shall and will teach and instruct or otherwise Cause to be well and Sufficiently taught and instructed after the best way and manner he Can and shall and will also find and allow unto the said Apprentice, Meat, Drink washing, Lodging and Apparel, both Linnen and woollen and all other necessaries in Sickness and in Health, meet and Convenient for Such an Apprentice during the Term Aforesaid; And at the Expiration of the Said Term, shall and will give to his said Apprentice (over and above his then Clothing) three pounds proclamation Money, and One Sufficient Suit of wearing Cloaths as is fit and usefull for Such an Apprentice. IN WITNESS whereof the said Parties have hereunto Set their Hands and Seals the Day and Year first above Written.
