the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and
late dweller in Johnston County
Sixty I Job Rogers in Orange County in the province of
North Carolina being very Sick and weak in Body but of
perfect mind and Memory thanks be given unto God for the
same and Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and
knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die Do
make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is
to say principally and first first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it,
and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried
in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discretion
of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Res-
urrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty
power of God and as touching such worldly Estate where-
with it has pleased God to Bless me in this Life I give
devise and Dispose of the same in manner and form fol-
lowing that is to say It is my Will that all my Just
and Lawfull Debts be paid and funeral Expenses -
Item I give and Bequeath to my Loving Wife Mary Rogers
one feather Bed and furniture together with all other
Housel Stuff and Side Saddle and Cattle all which is in
her own possession with forty Shillings a Year during
her Natural Life all which I give in Lue or instead of
her Wright of Dowry and Power of thirds of my Estate
Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Rogers

One half of my Land Lying on town Creek and one Yoke of Oxen lent to him in time past together with Several other Creaturs and Sums of Money lent to him and his heirs or assigns forever, but if the aforesaid Land should be sold before my Decease then I give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Rogers two hundred Acres of Land to be made a Title to him by my Executors Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Peleg Rogers the one half of my Land on town Creek together all my Land upon Nuse River and all Negroes found to be mine at my Decease all Stocks of Horses Cattle, Hogs, Sheep and all living Creaturs, furthermore I give to my Son Peleg Rogers all Bills, Bonds, and Moneys Due with all other Good Wares, Merchandise, Purse and Apparnel to him and his Heirs and assigns forever, furthermore if my Son Peleg Rogers should die without Ishue then I give and Bequeath to my Grandson Job Rogers Second Son of Thomas Rogers the Lands upon Nuse River heretofore given to my Son Peleg Rogers to him and his Heirs forever - And of this my last Will and Testament I make Constitute Nominate ordain and appoint my well Beloved Son Peleg Rogers my whole and Sole Executor Revoaking and Disannuling all former Wills by me heartofore made Rectifieing and Confirming this and
