In the Name of God Amen, I Nathaniel Kimbrough of Wake County and State of North Carolina being Sick & Weak in Body but of Sound Mind and Memory make this my last Will and Testament making null and Void all other Will or Wills heretofore by me made and first and foremost I give and bequeath my Soul to God that first gave it to me and my Body to be Desently Enterd at the Piscretion of my Executors and as to my Worldly Estate I give and Bequeath in manner & form following (Viz.)

Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Mary One Negroe Man Named Davy One Negro Woman Named Jude One Negro Boy Named Stafford and One Negro Man Blacksmith Named Granville and One Set of Blacksmiths Tools and One third part of all my Household & Kitchen furniture one eighth

part of all my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hoggs, Sheep &c to her her Heirs and Assigns forever also the Use of the Land Plantation whereon I now live during her Natural life of Widowhood. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Flizabeth Warren One Negro Boy Named Ben One Negro Girl Named Darkess & all my right to a Negro Boy Named Sam One Horse Bridle and Saddle One feather Bed and furniture all which Negroes and things are already delivered and all that other part of my Estate now in her possession to her her Heirs & Assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Moore One Negro Man Named Davy One Negro Girl Named Winney and all my right and Title to a Negro Boy Named Jessee One Horse, Bridle and Saddle One feather Bed and furniture all which Negroes and things is allready delivered to her with all that other part of my Estate allready in her possession to her her Heirs

and Assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Grandaughter Sarah Kimbrough Daughter of Daughter Charity One Negro Girl Named Silvy to her her Heirs and Assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Sons John and James all my Lands to be equally divided between them when they Come of Age or Marry and each of their parts I give to them their Heirs and Assigns forever. Item My Will is that all my Estate Real and Personal not heretofore Mentioned shall remain together untill One of my Children (this is now unmarried Comes of Age or Marrys and then to be equally divided between my Daughter Charity my Daughter Gilley my Daughter Penny, my Son John my Son James, my Daughter Polley my Daughter Salley and the One that first Marrys or Comes of Age to take their Eaquel part out of that part of my Estate and the remaining part to Continue together untill the next Child comes of Age or Marrys, and so on unto the last and all and each of their parts I give to them their Heirs and Assigns forever. I Nominate and appoint my Brother John Kimbrough my Son John, Henry Warren John Hinton Junt and Thomas Hines whole and Sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Twelfth July A D. 1781 Signed Sealed & Acknowledged)
