Will and Testament in Manner and form hereafter mention-
ed. First and principal I recommend my Sole into the
hands of Almighty God the giver and my Body to be De-
cently Buried in the Earth at the Discretion of my Ex-
ecutors hereafter mentioned. Item my Will and desire
is that my Just Debts and funeral Charges be fulley paid
and Satisfied. Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Amos
Runals One Shilling Sterling to him and his Heirs. Item
I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Williams One
Shilling Sterling to her and her Heirs. Item I give

Item I do hereby apoynt and Nominate my Loving Wife Ann Runals and my Son William Runals whole and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament making Void all other Gifts heretofore made or Don in Testimony hearof I have hearto set my Hand and Seal this Twenty seventh Day of September In the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy Six.
