Wake County) To the Sheriff of the County of Wake Greeting. Whereas Timothy Duck late of the sd County was legally Drafter as one of the Militia thereof under my Command and having had Legal Notice failed

to

to Appear and perform his Tower of Duty agreeable to Law or to provide a Substitute for the same I do therefore in pursuance of an Act of Assembly in that Case made and provided Command you that of the Goods and Chattles Lands and Tenements of the said Timothy Duck (if to be found in your Bailiwick) you Cause to be levied so much thereof as will pay and Satisfy with the Charges thereof Ten Thousand Pounds Current Money of the s.^d State the same being Given to John Abernethie a Substitute hired for the said Timothy Duck whereof He is liable as the said Act of Assembly Directs Herein fail not and have you this Warrant so as to render an Account of your proceedings thereon to me.

Witness Thomas Wootten Colonel of the Militia of said County at the County aforesaid first day of April in the fifth year of American Independance Anno Dom. 1781 -

Levied on a Tract of Land and Plantation whereon the said Timothy Duck lives, On the North side of Neuse River and on both sides of Buck Head Creek -
