Imprimis I give & Bequeve to my well beloved Son Abraham all the Land as I possess above the mouth of Abbotts Creek with my manner Plantation oly reserving the Life of my Wife Agness in the manner Plantation next I give to my Son Jacob that part of Land on the South side of the said Creek from the mouth of bounces branch to the outside line - next I give to my Son Isaac the residue of my Land from the mouth of bounces ~~branch~~ branch to the River and as for household furniture I give and Bequeve to my Grandson Simms Abott one Cow and Calf and the first Colt that is fallen from either of my Mares and one feather bed the rest of my Household Stuf to my Wife Agness, I likewise give to my Son William five pounds proc. Money to be raised out of my Stock. Item I give to my Son John Eighteen pounds proc. Money I likewise make Constitut and Ordain my Espoused Agness and my well beloved Son Jacob to be my hole and Sole Executors in Witness Whereof I have hereunto I have set my hand fixed my Seal -
