In the Name of GOD Amen I William Moore of Wake  
 County and St Margarets Parish being through the abon-  
 dance Mercy and Goodness of God though Weak in Body of a  
 Sound and disposing Sense & Memory do make Constitute  
 Publish and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in  
 manner and form as following. First and Principal I  
 Recommend my Soul in to the hands of Almighty God the  
 giver my Body to be desently buried in the Earth at the  
 Discretion of my Executors hereafter Mentioned. Item  
 My Will & des ire is that is that first my Just debts  
 & funeral Char ges be fully Satisfyed and paid. Item  
 I give & Bequeat h

to my Son Lewis Moore four hundred & fifty Acres of  
Land lying on little lick Creek and One Negro Girl  
Call<sup>d</sup> Jude One Cow and Calf One feather Bed and furni-

Bequeath to my Son Mark Moore One Negro Boy Call<sup>d</sup> Ed-

Item I give to my Daugtor Nancy Moore One feather Bed  
and furniture to her and her Heirs; Item I give and be-  
queath to my Daugtor Patty Moore One feather Bed to her  
and her Heirs. Item I lend to my Wife Sarah Moore for  
Term of Life all the Remainder of my Estates of any kind  
or Nature Whatsoever, and after her decease my Will and  
desire is that the above lent Estate should be Equally

divided Between my Daughters that is to say between daugh-  
tor Mary Moore Nancy Eliz<sup>a</sup> Sarah, Susannah Patty, Tabby,  
Rebeckar, Rollans & Fanny Moore which I give & Bequeath  
to them & their Heirs forever. I do hereby Nominate and

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Last Will and Testament of John Dempster Dec<sup>d</sup>

In the Name of God Amen I John Dempster, Planter of Wake County being in perfect Health of Body & of Sound Memory thanks be to God; calling into Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all Men Once to Die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I do recommend & give my Soul unto Almighty God that gave it, my Body to be buried in a Christian burial if in the Power of my Executor Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the Almighty Power of God that gave it, as touching such Worldly Estate as it has pleased God to Endue me with at this time I give Demise and Dispose of in the following Manner Viz. first I do hereby appoint Capt. Simon Turner my Whole and Sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. My Estate to be disposed of in the following manner My Debts to be paid out of my Debts owing to me if not Sufficient the balance to be paid out of my Estate Item I give my whole Estate to the following Persons to be equally divided by my Executor John Turner Miss Mary Smith and Miss Winifred Turner if John Turner dies before he comes of Age this part of my Estate to be given to David Turner and Jonathan No Debts to be paid without properly proved. I do hereby Ascertain this my last Will & Testament. Witness my hand & Seal this 10th day of August 1776

I George Pool being at this time Sick in body and Reduced to a very Lo State of health but in perfect mind and memory do make and Eoknledg this my last Will and testament to Wit my Eldest Daughter Hester Stephens my Eldest Son Lewis and my Son William being of Age I have allready given them Distinctly all the part and parcel of my goods and Lands that I intend. I leave all the Rest of my Estate to my Beloved Wife Mary Pool During her Life or Widowhood and during the time Shee shall Keep the Children Shee hath had by me allso that Shee pay my Debts and if Shee shall marry or my Children be bound out I leave all my Land and Living to be Sold according to Law, and after all my Debts are paid then I give to my beloved Wife the One Third of all Such Money or Estate the Rest I give to be Equally Divided between my Daughter Elizabeth my Son Hardy my Son John and my Son George.
