The last Will and Testament of Young Allen.

In the Name of God Amen the twenty ninth Day of October in the Year of our Lord One thousand and Seven hundred and Seventy four, I Young Allen of Wake County

and Province of North Carolina being very Sick and Weak,  
Yet in proper Sence, mind, and Memory, thanks be given to  
Almighty God: But knowing that I am appointed Once to Die  
do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that  
is to say principally and first of all I Give and Recom-  
mend my Soul into the Hands of my Redeemer and for my  
Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Chris-  
tian like Manner, at the Discretion of my Executors Here-  
after Mentioned; And touching such Worldly Estate as it  
hath been please God to Bless me with in this Life, I  
give Divise and Dispose off in the following and form  
Imprimis after my Just Debts are paid I give and Bequeath  
to my Loving Son William Allen all that of the Tract of  
Land Whereon I now live Lying on the West Side of Horse  
Creek, to him and his Heirs forever. And the Remaining  
part of the said Tract of Land, I leave to be Equally Di-  
vided Between my other Sons, at my Son Josiah Coming to  
the Age of Twenty Years, which will be in the Year of One  
thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety (to wit) Coleman Allen,  
Robin Allen Young Allen, Drury Allen, Josiah Allen, and  
David Allen. Item I Lend to my Loving Wife Martha Allen,  
two Negroes (to wit) Will and Hagar, untill the Year of  
One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety and after the Ex-  
piration of the above said Term of 1790 my Will and Desire  
is that the above Said Negroes, Will, and Hagar, and their  
Increase together with two other Negroes (to witt) Jack  
and Dinah, with all and Singular the other Moveable Estate  
to be Equally Divided between all my Children. And I do  
hereby Appoint my Wife Martha Allen and William Allen my  
Hole and Sole Executrix & Executor of this my Last Will and  
Testament, Revoking all other Wills by me heretofore Made.  
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal  
the Day & date above Written.

THIS INDENTURE made this Ninth Day of December in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy four, between James Martin Esquire, presiding Justice of the Inferior Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions held in and for the County of Wake in behalf of himself and his Successors in Office, of the One part, and James Jones Jun<sup>r</sup> of the County of Wake of the Other part. WITNESSETH that the said James Martin and the rest of the Justices, of the Said Inferior Court according to the form of the Act of Assembly of the Said Province made in the third Year of his present Majestys Reign, entitled an Act for the better Care of Orphans, and Security and Management of their Estates, have put out and Bound Samuel Tate Orphan of James Tate Deceased, and a poor Child of Wake County aforesaid, apprentice to the said James Jones Jun<sup>r</sup> untill the said Samuel Tate shall come to the Age of Twenty One Years - being on or About the Ninth Day of Dec<sup>r</sup> last past of the Age of Nine Years, during which time this said Apprentice
