give and bequeath to my son Mark Brumitt five shillings Sterling money. Now
I give and bequeath to my son William Brumitt one Negro boy named Robin
Now I give and bequeath to my son Moses Brumitt one Bed and furniture and
three head of Cattle and my riding Mare. Now I give and bequeath to my daughter
Martha Brumitt one natural pearing Mare colt one Cow and calf & so I give

I Now Give and Bequeath to my son James Bonnett our Negro gill named Joan
and her increase. I Now Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Bonnett one Cow
and Calf. I Now Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Amory Bonnett one Cow and Calf
I Now Give and Bequeath to my loving wife Ann Bonnett the use of all my
whole Estate during life or widowhood my desire is and will is that all the
Remainder of my Estate that I have not already given what so ever or
where so ever after the limited time to be equally divided between my three Daughters
to wit Martha Ann and Amory. Furthermore my will and desire is that my
three sons to wit Richard Mark and William shall divide the same. I Now
I do hereby ordain constitute appoint my loving wife Ann Bonnett Mark
Bonnett and William Bonnett my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will
and Testament wholly disannulling all former Wills heretofore by me made In

day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred sixty & four
