Cattle and four head of Sheep and my Skin makers tools and our Sleds. Item I  
give and bequeath to my son Mark Bonitt five shillings Sterling money. Item  
I give and bequeath to my son William Bonitt one hoges boy named Robin  
Item I give and bequeath to my son Moses Bonitt one Bed and furniture and  
three head of Cattle and my riding Mare. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter  
Martha Bonitt one natural peccing Mare colt one Cow and calf 30 Fishers
