royal and personal.

I appoint my beloved wife Jane Carter with my beloved son Philemon
Edwards executors of this my last Will and Testament published May 15. 1765.

Temple one Negro boy called or named Tom to hold to the said Samuel Temple
his heirs & executors & Assignees to him & their only property & school for ever
and I the said Henry Temple do bind the said Negro boy Tom unto the said Samuel
Temple his heirs & executors & Assignees forever shall & will warrant & defend
against me my heirs & executors & all other persons whatsoever in Nitress
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of June 1765
