 35<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Jane, Harbison Ten shillings  
 36<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Hannah Allen Ten shillings  
 37<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved son Philemon Edwards after my wife's  
 decease all my Estate not before given or bequeathed wholly and solely both  
 Royal and personal.

38<sup>th</sup> I appoint my beloved wife Jane Exec<sup>r</sup>. with my beloved son Philemon  
 Edwards Exec<sup>r</sup> of this my last Will and Testament published May 15<sup>th</sup> 1765.

 in hand paid by Samuel Temple of Prince George County in the County of Virginia  
 I have & do by these presents grant bargain sell & deliver unto the said Samuel  
 Temple one Negro boy called or named Tom to hold to the said Samuel Temple  
 his heirs Ex<sup>r</sup>s. Adm<sup>r</sup>s. & Assigns to him & his only proper heirs & assigns for ever  
 and I the said Henry Temple the said Negro boy Tom unto the said Samuel  
 Temple his heirs Ex<sup>r</sup>s. Adm<sup>r</sup>s. & Assigns for ever. Shall & will warrant & for ever  
 defend against me my heirs Ex<sup>r</sup>s. & Assigns & all other persons whatsoever In Witnes  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of June 1765
