Wood all my other goods and Chattle with Stocks of all kind till the day of my
children come of Age and then as they come of Age to have their portions

opinion my trusty friends John Foster and my loving wife to be Executors of
this my last Will and Testament revoking and disannulling and making void
all other former Testaments heretofore by me made or that this be my last
