Admin^r within one year after the date of these presents & all the rest & residue of the said Goods Chattels & Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Acc^t the same being first examined allowed by the Gov^r & Council General Court or County Court, shall deliver & pay unto such person or persons respectively as the same shall be due pursuant to the true intent & meaning of this Act in that case made & provided and if it shall happen that any Will & Testament was made by the said Decd. and the Ex^r or Ex^{tr} thereof intended to exhibit the same into Court making request to have it allowed & approved of accordingly if the said Elizth Young being therunto required do render & deliver the said Will or Testaments of such Testament being first had examined in the said Court then this Obligation to be void else to be & remain in force.
