First I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Amanda Ellen Allen all of my real and personal property of what soever nature or description and whatsoever situated (Except money, Notes and accounts) to have and to hold to her the said Amanda Ellen for and during her natural life.

Second, Upon the death of my said wife Amanda Ellen then it is my will and desire that all of my estate both real and personal shall be ours and I do hereby give, devise and bequeath upon such occurrence the same to three of my children viz: John B. Allen, Nathan N. Allen, Walter R. Allen, Albert S. J. Allen and Virginia Ausbon wife of Sam'l F. Ausbon

Having heretofore provided for my other two children viz: Joseph S. and Thomas J. Allen by deeds of gift in real estate in equal share and interest to each and all, except John B. Allen who is indebted to me by note in the sum of Fifty Dollars, for the purchase of one horse which is to be deducted from his share or interest in my said estate after the death of my said wife to them the said John B. Allen, Nathan N. Allen, Walter R. Allen, Albert S. J. Allen and Virginia Ausbon, to have and hold and their heirs in full sparkle forever.

Third, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Amanda Ellen all the Money, Notes and accounts which I may be possessed of at my death to have and to hold for her use and benefit providing however for my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid out of the same.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Amanda Ellen Allen to be Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal 5<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eighty six.
