

I Wilson Ambrose of the County of Washington
 And State of North Carolina, being of sound mind
 And Memory. And considering the uncertainty of my
 earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will
 And Testament in manner and form following that is
 to say
 First that my executor (hereinafter named) shall provide
 for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of
 my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses
 together with my first debts, howsoever and to
 whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first
 come into his hands as apart or parcel of my estate
 I give and devise to my beloved wife my land &
 building lying on the North side of the road where
 I now live during her natural life In case she and
 my Son Warren Ambrose do not agree my Son may
 have the right and privilege to move the stone fence
 and baton fence across the road on his own land
 I also give my wife one chair, harness, harness, one
 cart one Buggy, plough, harness, two cows & calves
 two beds & stads and all the kitchen furniture, but
 none of the said property to be disposed off by my said
 wife and after her death all of the said property
 (land & personal) to go to my Son Warren Ambrose also
 if there be a growing crop or one on hand she is to have
 what three men may say is sufficient for her
 support for twelve months. I give unto my Son
 Warren Ambrose all of my land that is on the
 South side of the main road of the said farm
 with the exception of thirteen acres that I give to
 my daughter Anna E. Robinson and children
 running parallel with the land that I gave her
 to the Woodlawn farm my Son Warren Ambrose is
 to pay to my three grand children Herbert R. Spruill
 Clarence Spruill & Raman Spruill one hundred dollars
 each as they become twenty one years of age and if
 either one or all should die before they are age then the
 said Warren Ambrose will not have to the money pay
 I give to Anna J. Ambrose fifty dollars to pay by
 my Son Warren in one & two years after my death
 And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son
 Warren Ambrose my lawful executor to all intents and
 purposes to execute this my last will and testament and
 my friend J. P. Hilliard & friend my son
 J. P. Hilliard B. B. Phelps & Wilson Ambrose

Paying as per. Warren Ambrose in Executor named in said will and to be substituted to the
 said executor by law for the question of executor and after same issue to him
 (as of this day) the 21st day of April 1892
