

I Lloyd Baltimore of the County of Washington and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my life do make and declare this my last will and testament this 15th day of March 1880 First I do my executor hereinafter named shall provide for my body & decent burial and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts and that he shall of same control and direction of my estate both real and personal and dispose of the same in the manner hereinafter incident without unnecessary delay I do my undivided interest into the one half of that part of lot number 154 situated in the town of Plymouth County and State of North Carolina with the store warehouse and all other improvements belonging to the same together with all my interest in and to the stock of goods wares and merchandise now stored in said buildings on said lot and wherein the business of the firm of Jackson & Baltimore composed of James C. Jackson and myself Lloyd Baltimore is now conducted I will and desire that my executor shall take charge of and by and with the consent of James C. Jackson as surviving partner or his lawful representative proceed to sell the said property both real and personal of every description now owned by said firm and after paying all just and lawful debts due by said Jackson & Baltimore I will apply the remainder of my interest in and to said firm property together with all other real & personal estate belonging to me in any manner whatsoever in the following form and manner that is to say

To my brother of the free blood Augustus A. Baltimore and to my sister of the free blood Mary V. Rice of Dr. U.S. Hopkin both of Martin County and State of North Carolina I devise and bequeath to each of them and severally three Eighths (3/8) of the entire amount realized from the sale of all my property and to my sister of the half blood Fannie L. Baltimore of Martin County the remaining two Eighths of said amount received from the sale of said property mentioned. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved brother Augustus A. Baltimore herein before mentioned my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills & testaments by me heretofore made.
