Give my undivided interest into the one half of Water part of lot number 154 situated in the town of Plymouth County and State aforesaid with the store warehouse and all other improvements belonging to the same together with all my interest in and to the stock of goods wares and merchandise now stored in said buildings on said lot and wherein the business of the firm of Jackson & Baltimore composed of James C. Jackson and myself Lloyd Baltimore is now conducted. I wish and desire that my executors shall take charge of and by and with the consent of James C. Jackson as surviving partner or his lawful representative proceed to sell the said property both real and personal of every description now owned by said firm and after paying all just and lawful debts due by said Jackson & Baltimore shall apply the remainder of my interest in and to said firm property to gettors with all other real & personal estate belonging to me in any manner whatsoever in the following form and manner that is to say.

to my brother of the full blood Augustus A. Baltimore and to my sister of the full blood Mary V. wife of Dr. W. S. Hopkins both of Martin County and State aforesaid I devise and bequeath to each of them and separately three Eighty (\$80) of the entire amount remaining from the sale of all my property and to my heirs of the half bloodannie L. Baltimore of Martin County the remaining two Eighty of said amount received from the sale aforesaid mentioned. Lately. I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved brother Augustus A. Baltimore herein before mentioned my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and disclaiming utterly void all other wills & testaments by me heretofore made.
