I Nancy E. Bateman of said County and State being of sound mind and memory do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament. Item 1st. My will is that my one half undivided interest in the tract of land on which I now live be sold by my executor herein after named, after the death of my husband Mrs. W. M. Bateman, who shall occupy it his lifetime, and the proceeds divided as follows: First to pay my burial expenses to whomsoever the same may be due at the death of my said husband. Second: The balance to be divided between the Methodist Protestant Church at Plymouth, N.C. Mary E. Garrett, William M. Bateman for his daughter Gertrude Eliza Bateman to be used for her education at his discretion and without his giving bond for same; and John Richardson Ward son of W.B. Ward to be used just as that given to the daughter of W.M. Bateman, except it shall be managed and used by W.B. Ward. The said M.P. Church and Mary E. Garrett shall each have one third interest of said balance of my said estate, and the other third shall go to said children of W.M. Bateman and W.B. Ward as above mentioned. My burial expenses to be paid as above directed shall not exceed fifty dollars. I name and appoint W.H. Ward my lawful executor to execute this my will, and he shall sell said land at private or public sale as he may deem best at the time above mentioned, and he is authorized and empowered to execute deed therefor to the purchaser. My said executor may sell said land or any part thereof before the death of my said husband if he shall agree to such sale, and the said M.P. Church, Mary E. Garrett, W.M. Bateman and W.B. Ward shall also agree to same, and apply the proceeds as above directed. Or if either said Church Mary E. Garrett W.M. Bateman or W.B. Ward shall agree to such sale, then my executor shall sell their interest therein and the purchaser shall hold the same free from any further liability to the one that may agree to such sale. Their consent to such sale shall be evidence by their signature to the deed executed by said executor.
