I and to my wife Chloa Francis during her life time or widow hood all the estate of which I may die possessed, all and every part real and personal consisting of lands and chattels namely the house hold and kitchen furnished farming utensils living stock and provisions for her support and maintenance and for the support and maintenance of two six children Joseph M. George W. Marcus V. Hayward L. A. Pharo M. Francis W. and Margaret C. my daughter by a former wife who is of simple mind.

And after the death of my wife Chloa Francis. I give and bequeath to her aforesaid six children named in Item 1st and to such of them as shall be surviving all and every part of my aforesaid estate as named and described in Item 2nd to be divided equally among them Not to come on condition that they shall always support and maintain their half sister Margaret C. as long as she may live and in case that these my six children aforesaid or as many of them as may be surviving shall refuse or neglect so to support and maintain the said Margaret C. then my will is and I order that my whole land shall be sold and the proceeds thereof and my daughter Margaret placed in the hands of a suitable executor properly justified legally. and he shall support and maintain her out of the same as long as she may live and at her death the remainder of such proceeds and funds shall be divided among my six children aforesaid.
