 and memory but considering the uncertainty of my
 earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will
 and Testament in manner & form following that is to say.

First. That my Executor (hereinafter named) shall provide
 for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of
 my relatives & friends. I pay all funeral expenses together
 with my just debt to whom and to whomsoever owing
 out of the moneys that may first come into his hands
 as a part and parcel of my estate.

- Second. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Courtney

- Third. I give and bequeath to my son W. T. Colburn all of my

 dollars and one note for \$100.00 One hundred and fifteen
 dollars. I give him all interest on the two notes extra
- Fifth. And give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Jones
 one fifth of my entire estate personal and real estate
 except what is given above.
- Sixth. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary E.
 Robertson one fifth of my entire real estate and per-
 sonal property except what is mentioned above. If
 Mary E. Robertson should die what I have given her
 I give to her children.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Warren Colburn one fifth of all of my personal property and real estate, except what is given herebefore in my will. I give this to her in trust to be held by C. C. T. to be invested as he may see proper, and for him to pay to her when she becomes of years old, with what interest he can get on the investment and I hereby absolve him by Guardian as far as what I give her is concerned. If she should die without children then her part to be equally divided between the other heirs. And I do hereby constitute and appoint C. C. T. my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last Will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and Clause thereof. And by reading and declaring utterly void all other Wills and testaments by me herebefore made.
