Item 2<sup>d</sup> I further more leave to my wife Betsy Craft all of my stock to wit One black Mare and One sorrel mare and One bay Cott and eleven heads of hogs & one East and One Pocaway and all of my farming tools and house hold and kitchen furniture from mortgaged or disturbed during her natural life provided she not marry in case she should marry the forfeits her right and interest forever

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I leave to my daughter Jane Ten dollars and also to my daughter Mary Ten dollars to be paid at my death

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I leave to my two sons John S & J. T. Craft at my wife death or manage all of my property to be equally divided between my two sons above named

Item 4<sup>th</sup> It is further my will & desire that my executors at their own will and discretion shall sell that portion of my property which they may think proper to pay my wife and have her decently buried

Item 5<sup>th</sup> It is further my will & desire that my executors at their own will and discretion shall sell that portion of my property which they may think proper to pay my wife and have her decently buried

I do hereby constitute and appoint Joe A. Chipson and W. H. Spornill my lawful executors with full power and authority to this my last will and testament

6 I gave and Bequeath to Luis Comstock One Hundred dollars to have and to hold to him and his Heirs in fee simple forever.

7 Item My will and desire is that all the residue of my Estate after taken out the devises and legacies above mentioned that such surplus shall be Equally divided and pay over to Mary J Oliver the daughter of Elizabeth Comstock, also to Josephine Comstock, & Virginia Comstock & Donon Comstock in equal proportion share and share alike to them and each and every of them their Executrix administrator and assigns absolutely forever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and Appoint my Trusty friend Joshua B Davenport my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof clearly marking and declaring attorney for all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made in writing witness I the said Mary Bateman do hereunto set my hand and seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1874
