I give unto my beloved wife Celia Davenport all of my property  
real and personal and mixed of what nature or kind soever  
and whereso the same shall be at the time of my death,  
during her natural life.

I also give my beloved wife power to sell any thing after my  
death if she is in need of it for her subsistence, first the personal  
property, and then the land if necessary forces her to do so;  
I give and devise to my Grand Son James E. Davenport the land  
whereso I now live containing 50 acres more or less.

I give and devise unto my Son Doctorin J. Davenport all of  
my blacksmith tools of every description, and the balance  
of my property to be equally divided unto my lawful heirs  
and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty  
friend Alex Armstrong my lawful executor to all intents  
and purposes to execute this my last will and testament  
according to the true intent and meaning of the same and  
every part and clause thereof hereby rubbling and declaring  
utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made  
in witness whereof I the said Stephen A. Davenport do hereunto  
set my hand and seal.
