First, My Executors, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, out of the first moneys which may come into this hands, belonging to my estate.

Second, I give and devise to my son, Addison Everett, and his heirs, in fee simple, a two-thirds interest in the tract of land on which I now reside, in the town of Plymouth, N.C., bounded as follows: On the north by Main or 2nd street, on East by a lane, on South by J. H. Beasley's line, on West by a swamp, and known as the Duggin Place, containing one acre, more or less, being land conveyed by deed from Thos. S. Amistead to Rose Everett, dated May 20th, 1872, and duly registered in Book "J," pages 20 and 24, Reg. Deeds office, said County.

Third, I give and devise to my son, Benjamin Everett, and his heirs, in fee simple, a one-third interest in the tract of land described in the Second of this will.

Fourth, I give and devise to my said sons, Addison, and Benjamin Everett, all of my personal property, consisting of household and kitchen furniture, of whatever kind and value I possessed of at the time of my death, to be divided as the law is, that is to say, Addison is to have two-thirds of same and Benjamin is to have one-third, to be sold or divided, as they may see proper.

Fifth, I hereby constitute, and appoint my two sons, Addison Everett and Benjamin Everett, my lawful Executors to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last Will and Testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
