Second I devise my tract of land known as the James M. White land and also the tract of land containing thirty six acres purchased of W.L. Brown dead dated Feb. 1st 1882 and known as the James White land to my son John P. Framan and his daughters Lavinia Allen wife of his alias my daughter Deborah E. Hembree wife of Abram Hembree my daughter Eliza Mizell wife of H.P. Mizell and the children of my deceased daughter Mary Jane Allen former wife of Asa R. Allen their heirs and assigns the children of my said deceased daughter to take one share between them and in case of any of my said children should die without issue leaving at his or her death the same or portions of such child or children so during their going to and dying in their or their surviving brothers or sisters
