

I Harmon Harrison of the County of Washington State of North Carolina, being of sound mind And disposing Memory do make and declare this My last Will and Testament as follows
 1st That my Executors hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends And all funeral expenses together with my just debts however And to whomsoever out of the money that may first come into his or her hands apart or parcel of my estate.

2nd I give and devise to my son H. J. Harrison a tract of land on the west side of Beans Dam adjoining Emuley Ange and others, containing about fifty acres. I give to him during his life time and then to his heirs

3rd I give and devise to my Daughter Jaica C. Swinson a tract of land on the east side of Beans Dam; Beginning at a Gully corner that David Ayers sold to his brother Isaac about fifty acres more or less and also a tract or piece of land known by the name of the Pelijohn Okey Nale two hundred acres more or less. All I give to her one half of my Cattle stock also one half of my household and kitchen furniture except two beds which I give to Mahitabel F. Harrison one bed and James W. Harrison one bed. I also give to my Daughter Mahitabel F. Harrison a tract of land whereon I now live containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less. In all the land lying between the two tracts that I give to Jaica C. Swinson also the dwelling house and all and houses also my farming utensils to Jaica and to hold for ever. Also I give to her one half of my house, shed and kitchen furniture and all of my hog stock and all of my bee stock also one half of my Cattle stock. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son-in-law and my Daughter Mahitabel F. Harrison my Executors to execute this my last Will and fully administer my estate according to law
