Fork

I give and devise to my wife Edward B. Harrison all that tract of land, which I purchased of L B Waters & E B Waters (and fully described in the deed to me)

for her life and after her death I devise the said land to my sons Edward W. Harrison Henry B. Harrison and Luther D. Harrison to be equally divided between them Edward W. Harrison is to have the land north to White place on the north side of the public road

Henry B. Harrison is to have the land north to Ward bridge on the north side of said road and Luther D. Harrison is to have the land on south side of the road north to the Ford place and my said wife shall have the right and power to cut and sell all of the Pine & ^{Juniper} timber on said land to pay the balance of the purchase money and B. Waters

Second, I give and devise that tract of land on the Long ridge road, given to me by the last will of my father Edward Harrison to my wife A. B. Harrison and my two daughters Ellen E. Ambrose and Liza W. Hopkins to be equally divided between them in fee simple Third, I give and devise to my wife

A. B. Harrison my present place known as the Mill property in fee simple Fourth, I give all my personal property of every kind and description to my wife A. B. Harrison to do as she please with Fifth, I hereby appoint my wife A. B. Harrison executrix to this my last will and testament Jun 18th 1895

In the name of the Lord I Baley Phelps (being of sound mind & in good health as well as memory) do make and ordain this my last will and testament. As follows I give and bequeath to my Daughters Lucy and Chas Chasfon Andrew Oliver their life time One Certain piece of land which I give to them at my death then they are to take charge of the same land and have it and all the improvements there on their life time and at their death to my grand Children which is the Children of Andrew Oliver & Lucy Oliver his wife. The boundary of the land I will now give as follows. Beginning at the mouth of the leading ditch on the north side of the main road thence running along the Furlough line Westerly along the Furlough line till it comes up parallel with a two foot ditch thence the corner of the two foot ditch to the back line thence along the back line easterly to Charles Mack's house line thence along his line to the main road and thence to the mouth of the Leeds ditch to the first station which I give not to be sold by the said Oliver during his life time. My wife Alice I give my son Stephen Phelps proprietor of his dream way thence the line that I have given to Andrew Oliver & Lucy his wife & my grand Children to the lead ditch. All the water ways go. Now I give and bequeath to my Son Jayuel Phelps all the lands lying to the West of the lands that I have given to my son Stephen Phelps from Stephen's corner which is the West corner Road I give this piece of land to my Son Daniel Phelps and his wife Clara his wife their

life time and at their death to my grand Children which is the Children of my Son Daniel Phelps and his wife Clara Phelps and their Children I give and at my death the same free portion of this land and the improvements there on at my death. I give to my Son William C Phelps one City & Cal and One musket at my death besides what I have all ready given him. Now I give and bequeath to my grand Children which is the Children of my Son Baley Phelps which is died Fifty dollars at my death of the parsable property at its be sold & a half of it to give them fifty dollars and if not a half to be found to give them fifty dollars then the rest of the heirs which is Oliver & Stephen and Daniel & pay one to Baley's heirs one dollar a piece to them which is three dollars to be paid over to Baley's heirs and William Phelps to Phelps pay the three dollars his equal parts of it. Now I the said Baley Phelps if any property to be found it is my will and testament for it to be equie divided betwixt all my Children & grand
