if both said Allon & Lafayette die without leaving any  
part of his body thus living then & in this case to the said  
Rev Thomas T. Haughton.

I Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and devise and bequest all my other property,  
real and personal which I have now and may hereafter acquire  
to the same devisees & under the same limitations declared  
in Item first named.

I appoint and nominate the Rev Thomas T. Haughton  
as Executer of this my last will and testament. Signed  
sealed published by the testator Anna N. Drown in the presence  
of her and of each other by her request.
