I W. L. Langley, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament.

First, my executor hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second, I give and devise to my beloved wife, Ellen Langley, the tract of land whereon I now live, containing two acres more or less, for her natural life, then the said land shall go to James S. Smith, or his heirs in fee simple. Said land is bounded on the North beginning at the Mountain Canal, by G. W. Phelps, on the East by W. C. Clifton Langley, on the South by Wm. Hovell, and on the West by the Mountain Canal, together with all the chattel property that I may have, except our bed furniture, and our jewels, which shall go to Island Watson, if living at my death.

Second, I will to my son, W. C. Clifton Langley, the piece or parcel of land whereon he now lives, containing one and one half acres more or less, bounded as follows, on the West by W. L. Langley, on the North by G. W. Phelps, on the East by W. C. Clifton Langley, and on the South by Wm. Hovell, to have and to hold in fee simple.

Third, I will to my two daughters, Emma Miller, and Lenora Smith, Five Dollars each.

Fourth, I hereby constitute and appoint my hereby-named Chas. G. Smith, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
