I, Enoch H. Reay, of the aforesaid county and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First, I lend and devise unto my beloved wife, Mary E. Reay, all of my real and personal property, of whatever kind and whithersoever the same may be found during her natural life or widowhood.

Second, After the death of my beloved wife, I give and bequeath unto my son, Marcus E. Reay, all of my land on the South side of the back-woods road and running a straight line to Mr. J. B. Phelps' line, thence southerly with his line to Hilliard Besses line, thence along said Hilliard Besses line to Mrs. Parker Lucas' line, thence along his line westerly to the back-woods road.

Third, After the death of my wife as mentioned above, I give and bequeath unto my three daughters, namely, Ella Mary Broughton, Maggie Olive and Miller Christine Reay, all of my land on the North side of the back-woods road and west of the line as mentioned above which includes the place on which I do now live.

Fourth, I hereby revoke and declare utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made, by witness whereof I, the said Enoch H. Reay, do hereunto set my hand and seal, this 19th day of November, 1909.
