 thus concluding the same and plantation to do as she please with for ever
 time and now on conditions which I will speak of before the close of this will
 Now I Wiley Moore do give and bequeath unto my beloved son Joseph A. Moore
 as follows my red timber beds and bed and furniture and my few with wood
 made be set out and also my two facing Oak Walnut table and all well my
 farming utensils to him the said Joseph A. Moore to have and to hold and
 do as he please with for ever. Now I Wiley Moore it is my desire for the balance
 of Chattle, furniture and my dogs to be equally divided between my three beloved Children
 Abner H. Waters, Abby W. Jackson and Joseph A. Moore to have and to hold
 and do as they please with for ever. Now I Wiley Moore do give and bequeath unto
 my beloved son Joseph A. Moore all my land adjoining the land of Abner H. Waters and
 thus to do as he please with for ever. Now the condition that I Wiley Moore speak of
 comes in now of the aforesaid Joseph A. Moore was (Marion Labelle C. Jackson, Julia
 C. Wallace or Susan Ham or any one of Susan Ham's sisters the gift that I Wiley
 Moore has given him the aforesaid Joseph Moore in this will is all null and void
 he is entitled to have no part nor share in this will at all but if he were doctored
 one of them that named in this will it is my desire for him the aforesaid Joseph
 A. Moore to have all the gifts that subscribed in will for him to have and in joy
 and do as he please with for ever, Now of the aforesaid Joseph A. Moore should
 receive many one of these named in this will and a full part of the gifts that given him
 in this will it is my desire for the Chattle, furniture, that I Wiley Moore has given
 him to be equally divided between my three beloved Daughters Abner H. Waters and
 and Abby W. Jackson to them to have and to hold and do as they please with
 for ever, and the land that I Wiley Moore has given him the aforesaid
 Joseph A. Moore if he falls short of it is my desire for my two beloved Daughters
 to have it, it is my desire for Abby W. Jackson to have all the land on the
 south side of the Martin road and west side of the Washing road to have and
 and to hold and do as she please with for ever, and also it is my desire for
 Abner H. Waters to have the balance of my land on the north side
 of the Martin road and on the east side of the Washing in road
 for her to have and to hold and do as she please with for ever
