That I, L. R. Mayo, of the County of Beaufort, State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this, my Last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, hereby revoking and declaring null and void any other will or testament by me hitherto made, that is to say:

First: I direct that all my just debts, to whomsoever due, shall be paid out of any funds belonging to my estate which shall first be available for that purpose.
