be at the time of my death, upon the following terms, to
that is to say so long as she remains a widow, but if the
said Maria Pritchard shall remain, then all of the said
property devised to her in this will shall be sold to the
highest bidder for cash & the money arising from such
sale shall be placed in the Superior Court Clerk's office
for her & my children.

And Lastly, I do hereby constitute & appoint my
beloved wife Maria Pritchard my lawful executor to
execute this my last will & testament according to the
true intent & meaning of the same & every clause thereof,
hereby revoking & declining void all other wills hereunto
