 for the same do made and Publish this my last
 Will and testimony in manner and form following that is
 to say

I give and bequest to my dear wife Ester Reddick
 the house that we now live in and a part of the
 lot bounded as follows beginning at the South
 east corner of Emma Howard's lot and running a
 Northerly direction one hundred and fifty five feet
 to Charles Lathams line thence along Sam Lathams
 in an easterly direction sixty feet thence in an southerly
 direction one hundred and fifty five feet to my front
 fence thence along said fence sixty feet to first station
 to have and to hold forever

I hereby appoint Thomas F. Bembry my Executor of this
 my last will and testimony in witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this ~~10th~~ 21st day of
 March 1892. The above instrument consisting of one
 sheet was now here subscribed by Jerry Reddick the
 testator in presence of each of us and was at the
 same time declared by him to be his last will
 and testament and at his request we and each of
 us signed our names

 of full age to execute a will and was not under
 any restraint to the knowledge information or belief
