other books they may wish that I may have at my death  
to my two daughters Dorcas Comstock and Harofine  
Hough wife of C. A. Hough to be divided by themselves  
in fee simple forever.

6<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Dorcas Comstock the Bedstead  
Matthew and Heather bed known as the little bed in fee  
simple forever.

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Amenia  
Sawyer all the remainder of my personal estate to her
