

I, John H. Stricklerhafe, do make this, my last will and testament:

First. I direct that all my just debts be paid.

Second. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Bernice Stricklerhafe, upon her condition hereinafter set out the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000<sup>00</sup>); but this bequest is upon the express condition that the same be accepted as lies, and is full settlement and satisfaction, of any sum or sums of money which, at or after my decease, may be or become due and payable under or by virtue of a judgment or decree herefore rendered by the Superior Court of Washington County, North Carolina, whereby there was required to be paid by me to or for the use of the said Bernice Stricklerhafe the sum of eight dollars per month; and the legacy in this paragraph mentioned shall not be payable unless and until a valid release of said judgment or decree is delivered to my executors.

Third. I give and bequeath unto C. M. Tullow the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500<sup>00</sup>).

Fourth. I give and bequeath unto Smith Armistead, colored, the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200<sup>00</sup>).

Fifth. All the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal and mixed, whether heretofore or hereafter acquired by me, and whereover located, whether in the State of North Carolina or Virginia, or elsewhere, I give, devise and bequeath unto my sister, Frances Adelia Jones, the wife of D. S. Jones, for and during the term of her natural life, with remainder, after her death, to her son, Lawrence Dawson Jones, absolutely.

Sixth. I nominate and appoint D. S. Jones and C. M. Tullow as and for the executors of this will.

Seventh. I revoke all other wills and codicils written made by me.
