In the Name of God Amen.

I, Josephus H. Luce Jr., being of sound mind & memory  
and considering the termination of my earthly existence  
do make and declare this my last will & testament  
in manner and form following to wit:

that after my death my beloved wife Mary E. Luce if alive  
& if not my friends shall provide a decent burial for my  
body and pay all necessary expenses together with all my  
just debts from the money coming first to hand.

Item. 2 I give & bequeath to my wife Mary E. Luce during her  
life all the tract of land on which I now live consisting  
of 147 acres together with all my stock, tools, horses  
& mules with all carts & traps with all my provision  
tools of all kinds, other vehicles carts &c my tools & guns  
rifles & info J. H. Luce Jr. All my property info of all kinds  
in lieu of her power & your efforts for her brother & nephew  
J. and Eddie I be sorry with & release him all.

Item. 3 I give and bequeath to my oldest daughter Loretta  
Belcher my note & mortgage as they are found, on the  
2 Dunbar Solomon & son my watch and all the  
gold or got from me to the date of my death \$200 in place  
thereof.

Item. 4 I give & bequeath to my son Edward J. Luce one dollar  
& a suit of clothes & recommend him to all my children,  
don't let him suffer he is your brother we should in mind  
care for him & if he should ever become sound help him I  
have given to you.

Item. 5 I give & bequeath to my son Asa D. Luce my note & mortgage  
info H. G. Pipp as it is found at my death, with all I have  
written given off to him of money tool dish traps &c, nothing  
no charge affirms me or him in any way to the date of my death  
I give and bequeath to my daughter Ada V. Tolsey the  
Springfield tract of land as deeded to me by H. H. Smith  
my brother & drainings except my main road running  
across the said tract on N side to main road, said  
tract containing 115 acres, also one note against

Ben. Spruill or if it is paid before \$200. in cash together  
with all I have given to her before to the date of my death  
I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Belcher  
beside what she has had one note against H. H. Pipp \$100.  
and one note against Stephen Hulston as it stands so my  
debt or of paid before my death one thousand dollars cash  
from my money in hand at time of my death.

My debt is that Alice Morris & daughter to whom have  
all the residue of my estate real & personal after my  
wife died. I give & bequeath to Alice Morris the  
Hartley Beaufort tract of land from a straight line from  
the W. W. corner of Richard Belcher  
land an old fallen pine stump a buggy & apple dinner  
by it, stones along his line & to Edmund Belcher line  
stones northwardly along my son's line to the  
Deep swamp stones up along said swamp to a primitively  
corner on the N & corner of an island stone across said  
swamp along my & Eli Belcher line, stones along the swamp up  
it along my line & Eli Belcher line & Eli Belcher line to the NW corner  
corner, the beginning, along a boundary to J. H. S. from the  
SE corner, to Edmund Belcher line. I also give to her of my  
money a note sixteen thousand dollars with whatever balance  
I clinch my wife may give off to her & all the residue due  
to Josephus after my death except what is given to my  
beloved wife her lifetime then all the residue of lands & personal  
goods to Josephus Jr. for taking care of his mother & I omitted  
& appointed my wife & my daughter Loretta as my lawful  
executors to execute this my last will & testament the note  
are transferred to them & the money shall be paid over by my  
wife if not done by me & myself for by each one all  
my personal estate is for Josephus except what my wife  
gave off to A. Belcher & in case of death of Josephus his  
estate is unmarred given to be equally divided among  
all my children. I Josephus H. Luce do declare this  
my last will and Testament on this the 9th day of this  
year of Our Lord Nine hundred and nine in

Item. I give to C. W. Bassell my half brother ten dollars.  
Item. I give to Mary F. Bateman my half sister ten dollars & one  
dollar more given to me by her mother.  
Item. I give to Mrs. J. W. Hausee my niece Twenty five dollars.  
Item. I give to Mrs. Lizzie White my niece Twenty five dollars &  
one dollar more given to me by her mother.

I give to my beloved wife N. J. Hausee all of my fishing  
outfit out of my real & true and the balance of all my  
charter property.  
And finally I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty friend  
Mr. J. Harris my lawful executor to see intent & purpose to  
execute the my last will & testament according to the true  
intent and meaning of the same & every part & clause  
thereof hereby reciting and declaring intently and all other  
will & testaments by me hitherto made.
